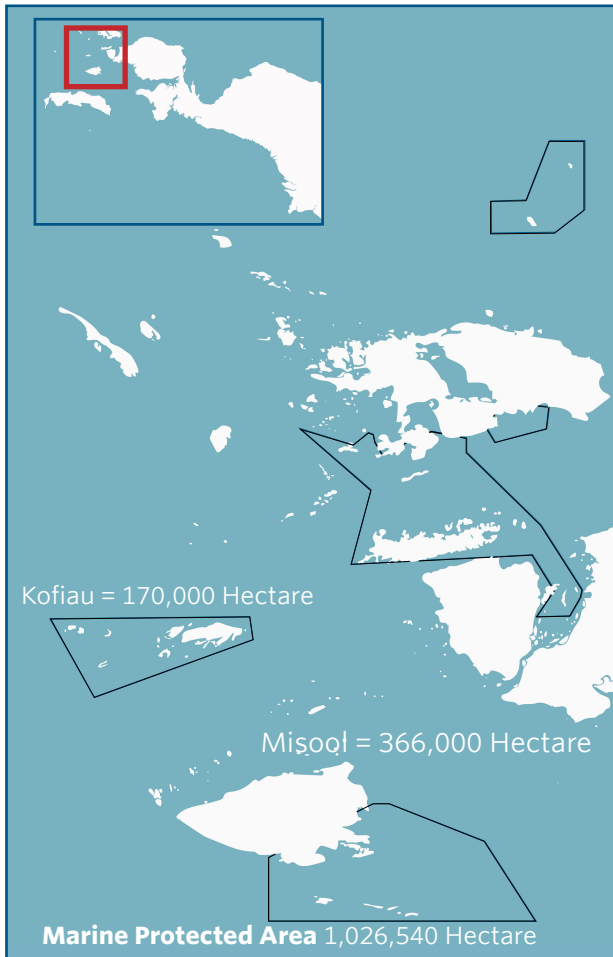

ISSUES

- Destructive fishing and excessive use of marine resources
- Unsustainable financing and management capacity for conservation of the area
- Transfer of authority in the management of MPA from District to Province
- Poor coastal and marine spatial planning and development of MPA
- Poor waste management practices and regulation, exacerbated by tourism activity and marine debris

- Community economic development through ecotourism development and local wisdom-based practices that support sustainable use of marine resources
